Arts Council Funding Request Update

With support from 79 other organizations across the state, Kentuckians for the Arts has submitted a funding request to the Kentucky Senate Appropriations and Revenue Committee to increase funding for the Kentucky Arts Council. The request is to increase annual funding in the FY25 budget to \$2,640,700. That amount would restore Arts Council state funding to its 2018 level.

The current proposed House FY25 appropriation (\$1,836,900) is below 1987 funding (\$1,983,300). Current per capita funding (40 cents) ranks Kentucky 45th in state funding for its arts agency. The cuts have impacted the Arts Council's capacity to implement its programs, which include operating grants to arts organizations through the Kentucky Arts Partnership program; marketing/business development services to artists and arts small businesses through the Kentucky Crafted program; and programs that showcase Kentucky arts heritage.

We'll send updates on the funding status as the budget process moves forward. The Senate A & R Committee will send the budget to the full house. After passage there it will go to a reconciliation committee made up of members of both chambers.

Ada Limon Named Time Woman of the Year

Poet Ada Limon continues to bring more positive attention to the Bluegrass State. Limon, the United States Poet Laureate (and a Lexington resident for more than a decade), has been named one of Time magazine's 12 Women of the Year for 2024. She and 11 other women being are recognized being "extraordinary leaders who for are working toward a more equal world." They will be honored in Los Angeles March 5. Limon became the first Latina U.S. Poet Laureate in 2022 and in 2023 became the first laureate to be appointed to a second term.

Folk & Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Grant Deadline Is March 29

The folk & traditional arts apprenticeship program is intended to celebrate Kentucky's folk artists and encourage the continuation of the traditional arts. It funds a mentorship program that allows experienced folk artists to train the next generation of traditional artists in their communities. Apprenticeships may last up to one year and must take place between July 15, 2024 and June 30, 2025. Grants may be requested for a maximum of \$4,000. Kentucky Touring Grant Application Deadline Is March 15

If you are interested in applying for the Kentucky Touring Grant, the application deadline is coming up fast! Applications are due on March 15 for the July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025 grant period. This grant provides presenters with support to book performers from the Kentucky Arts Council Performing Artists Directory. Applicants may request up to \$5,000 and match at least 25% of the requested award. Award notifications will go out in July 2024. For more information, visit the Kentucky Arts Council website.
