## **Celebrate Arts Education in September**

National Arts Education Week, coming up Sept. 10-16, is a good time to find out about arts education in Kentucky and to let elected officials and others know how the arts contribute to student success.

While arts programs may vary by school, a comparison of data for nine Southern states from the Education Commission of the States showed Kentucky, along with Florida and North Carolina, as relatively stronger arts ed states. Kentucky's strengths, according to the summary, included having instructional requirements for K-12th grade, an arts-specific graduation requirement, some licensure requirements for arts teachers, multiple programs for arts integration in schools, and an academic standards review process by the KentuckyDepartment of Education.

Kentucky, however, removed the arts from school accountability scores. State mandated assessments including the arts were replaced with Program Reviews in 2009. The Program Reviews of the arts were removed from the state accountability requirements in 2016.

## National Update: Time to Support Arts Funding

With Congress concluding its summer recess after Labor Day, now is the time to advocate for arts funding on upcoming appropriations legislation impacting the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), arts education, and many other key federally funded cultural programs.

Some House Freedom Caucus members have been proposing deep budget cuts and inserting social and cultural amendments to various pieces of legislation that threaten free expression, choice, identity, and efforts to promote diversity and equity.

Please take a moment to urge Kentucky's Senators and your Representative to support the President's FY 2024 budget request of \$211 million each for NEA and NEH funding. Also urge them to vote no on any weakening amendments that lower funding levels or limit artistic expression.

## South Arts Grants Deadlines Coming Up

The deadline to apply for the **South Arts Southern Prize and State Fellowships for Literary Arts** has been extended to September 8, 2023. The genre this year is fiction. A national jury will select one winner per state in the nine states served by South Arts (including Kentucky), based on artistic excellence that reflects the diversity of artistic expression of the region. Each fellow will receive a \$5,000 award, and the nine awarded State Fellows will compete for the \$25,000 Southern Prize for Literary Arts. Application information is available at the <u>South Arts web site</u>.

The application deadline for Jazz Road Tour grants is September 19. The program provides grants of \$5,000 to \$15,000 to support three- to six-site tours at an array of venue types, often in rural communities and other areas traditionally underserved by the genre. Tours funded in this grant cycle must take place between January 1, 2024 and June 30, 2024. A new grant cycle for tours between April 1, 2024 and October 1, 2024 will open October 17.

#### St. James Court Named Top Arts Fair in Nation

The St. James court Art Show was recently named the #1 "Best Fine Art and Design Show" by Sunshine Artist magazine. This prestigious national ranking lists the 200 most profitable art shows in the country based on artists' reported 2022 sales. Held in Louisville's historic St. James Court neighborhood, the fair annually hosts more than 600 artists and attaches around 250,000 attendees. The 67th annual show is coming up October 6-8.

The National Quilt Museum in Paducah was recently named a 2023 Travelers' Choice Award winner by Tripadvisor. #### Two Kentucky Sites Part of South Arts Southern Circuit Tour of Independent Filmmakers

Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green and the Living Arts & Science Center in Lexington are among the 20 Screening Partner venues for the 2023-24 Southern Circuit Tour of Independent Filmmakers. This South Arts program connects U.S.-based documentary filmmakers with communities throughout the South for screenings and conversations around important stories and the art of filmmaking. ### **Applications Open for Youth Poet Laureate**

The Carnegie Center for Literacy and Learning is continuing its Youth Poet Laureate chapter in Lexington.
