Application deadlines for a variety of grants and arts support opportunities are coming up in December and early January:

Dec. 1: South Arts Jazz Road Tour Grants

Awards of up to \$15,000 to support artist tours at an array of venues. Info at South Arts website.

Dec. 2: Free People X Americans for the Arts (AFTA) Creative Spirit Fund

Students, parents, and teachers are invited to nominate a teacher for a \$4,000 award to support teaching art, music, dance, theater, creative writing, and other artistic disciplines. Info at AFTA website.

Dec. 2: Team Kentucky Spring 2023 Art Exhibit

Application for artwork to be exhibited at the Kentucky Capitol from Jan. 1 to June 30, 2023. Application at Gov. Andy Beshear's website.

Awards of up to \$5,000 to support day-to-day costs for Kentucky arts and cultural organizations affected by the western Kentucky tornadoes in December 2021 or the eastern Kentucky floods in July 2022. Info at the Arts Council website.

Dec. 19: Kentuckians for the Arts (KFTA) Youth Arts Council KFTA invites middle and high school students, college students and young adults not attending college aged 22 and younger to apply to become part of the KFTA Youth Arts Council. An Artistic First at the Kentucky Capitol

If you visit the Kentucky Capitol in Frankfort, be sure to check out its newest sculpture: a bronze of public education trailblazer Nettie Depp by Lexington sculptor Amanda Matthews. In a well-attended ceremony Nov. 11, Gov. Andy Beshear, First Lady Brittany Beshear, Lt. Gov. Jacqueline Coleman, and the Monumental Women of Kentucky Committee unveiled the work — the first large-scale monument dedicated to a woman inside the Capitol.



And in Paris, a Big Red Boost for Tourism

And we do mean BIG! The new mural of Secretariat painted by Jaime Corum is impossible to miss, spanning some three-and-a-half stories on the side of an historic building. The Kentucky artist joined local Chamber of Commerce and Tourism officials and a large crowd of well-wishers for the official unveiling Nov. 19.
