<p>Increasing public understanding about the arts</p> <p><i>“The arts are good for Kentucky’s economy.”</i></p> <p>No limits for nonprofits if activities are nonpartisan</p>	<p>Expressing support for the arts as an important policy issue</p> <p><i>“The Kentucky Arts Council is a wise use of state funds because of the return on investment it delivers.”</i></p> <p>No limits for nonprofits if activities are nonpartisan</p>	<p>Encouraging votes on pending legislation</p> <p><i>“Vote in favor of House Bill #123 to increase state funding for the arts.”</i></p> <p>Permitted for nonprofits within expenditure limits set by the IRS</p>	<p>Endorsing political candidates for elected office</p> <p><i>“Please vote for Candidate Jones because she supports the arts.”</i></p> <p>Prohibited for 501(c)(3) nonprofits.</p>
